And, we are once again challenged to fund the cost to relocate our collection and re-build our exhibits.

But, all of us at National Pinball Museum remain hopeful that we will soon welcome you to a new, bigger and better location—one that we can call home for many, many years. We know that securing a long-term, affordable lease remains a big challenge for a small, non-profit organization like the Museum, but we've championed this kind of challenge before – thanks to the community's support. And, we know that with your continued support we will come back stronger than ever.

I want to personally thank everyone who has visited and supported the Museum over the past two years. We hope you will continue your interest and support of National Pinball Museum, and more importantly of pinball.
